



History at Stoke by Nayland C of E Primary School

Overview:

Our history curriculum is based on a four year cycle of themes, where all children learn about different aspects of history through our whole school topics entitled 'Time Travellers', 'Ancient World', 'Suffolk' and 'Famous People from the Past'. During their time at SBN, children gain a coherent knowledge and understanding of British History and that of the wider world. They also learn about the history of music as part of collective worships and of art history through various art studies.

The table below highlights the historical 'flight path' that the children will follow depending on when they join the school.

The Big ideas:

The following big ideas are revisited in each historical topic, enabling children to place historical events chronologically, draw comparisons between different eras and civilisations, and understand how the historical period influenced Britain today and how evidence from different sources enables us to draw conclusions about the past.

Chronology (including how this fits alongside learning about music and art)

Civilisation (what this looked like during each time and how this impacted Britain today)

Result (what did we learn? What did this do for Britain?)

Evidence (how do we know?)
