

- Other members of their household (including any siblings) should self-isolate for 10 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms and follow gov guidance for when they may leave the house
- Hand sanitiser stations at all entrances/exits
 EYFS children to be supervised by an adult
- Hand washing (for 20 seconds with soap) to be completed on entry to school, then when coming in from outside, before going into communal spaces, when leaving communal and before/after eating and sneezing/coughing
- Good respiratory hygiene promoted/taught 'catch it, bin it, kill it'
- Ensure all surfaces are sanitised and wiped down after use.
- Temperature to be taken if someone appears to have a raised temperature. If person has a raised temperature, they are to be isolated and sent home immediately. 'Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus infection' and 'Track and Trace' advice to be given.
- o If a new continuous dry cough develops, or the person has a loss of or change in their normal sense of taste or smell the person is to be isolated and sent home immediately. 'Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus infection' and 'Track and Trace' advice to be given.

Person displaying any symptoms must isolate for at least 7 days and be tested – see above for members of the same household. o Any members of staff who have helped someone with symptoms do not need to go home to self-isolate unless they develop symptoms. o If anyone in the school tests positive – school should contact the local health team. Those who have been in close contact (direct close contact, within 1-2m for more than 15 minutes, travelling in a small vehicle with an infected person) must be sent home and told to selfisolate for 10 days o PPE equipment to be used by any adult supervising a child who develops symptoms whilst at school. Child to be isolated immediately and use the disabled toilet if needed. ○ Children in Years 1 – 6 should socially distance as much as possible, O Staff should remain 1+ metres apart as far as possible. o Give frequent reminders to avoid touching of the face and about not touching their peers as much as possible. All Critical Worker and Vulnerable worker children will now form one bubble and staff may move freely in the bubble o Children to have their own school resources such as pens/pencils and frequently used items provided by school
